TRANSFER STUDENT CHECKLIST

Follow these next steps to help guide you through the transfer admission and enrollment process. You can also visit [LUC.edu/transfer](https://luc.edu/transfer) for more details.

1 GATHER YOUR COURSEWORK HISTORY.
Submit your college transcripts for review from all previous colleges you have attended. We will complete an official transfer credit evaluation after you are offered admission to Loyola.

2 SCHEDULE A PERSONAL VISIT.
Visit [LUC.edu/visit](https://luc.edu/visit) to schedule a convenient time to come to campus and meet with a transfer admission counselor and/or take a campus tour. Call **800.262.2373** or email visitloyola@luc.edu.

3 APPLY FOR ADMISSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS.
To be considered for admission, complete an application at [LUC.edu/transfer](https://luc.edu/transfer). There is no fee to apply, and your application for admission is also your merit scholarship application.

Please also submit:

- An official academic transcript from all colleges attended

If you've earned less than 20 college credit hours, please submit:

- An official high school transcript or GED results
- Your SAT or ACT test scores

International students: look for additional admission requirements at [LUC.edu/applyinternational](https://luc.edu/applyinternational).

4 COMPLETE THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA).
Discover how the Financial Aid Office can help you. To be considered for as many financial aid sources as possible, submit your FAFSA before March 1 for Fall Semester and November 1 for Spring Semester. Visit [LUC.edu/finaid](https://luc.edu/finaid) to learn more.

To complete the FAFSA, visit www.fafsa.ed.gov. Loyola's school code is 001710.

5 SUBMIT YOUR ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT.
After admission, make your deposit at [LUC.edu/deposit](https://luc.edu/deposit).

6 APPLY FOR HOUSING.
If you have less than 56 credit hours, you're required to live on-campus or at home with your parents/guardian. For information about student housing options, visit [LUC.edu/reslife](https://luc.edu/reslife).

7 SUBMIT YOUR MEDICAL RECORDS.
Before you can register for classes, you'll need to submit your medical records. Learn more at [LUC.edu/wellness/tools/immunizations/](https://luc.edu/wellness/tools/immunizations/).

8 ATTEND TRANSFER ORIENTATION.
After you submit your deposit, register for orientation, where you'll meet with an academic advisor, meet new friends, and register for classes. Learn more at [LUC.edu/orientation](https://luc.edu/orientation).

TRANSFER STUDENT FAQ

What are the application requirements?

Complete your application at LUC.edu/transfer. Once you have finished your application, you'll also need to send us official transcripts from all colleges you've attended. If you've completed less than 20 college credits at time of application, we will also need an official high school transcript or GED results, and your ACT or SAT scores.

GPA requirements vary by school but generally we are looking for students with a B average or better.

Are there resources for veterans returning to school?

We are pleased to offer a streamlined admission process for veterans. More info at LUC.edu/veterans.

Where should I send my application materials?

Once you've completed your application and have collected the necessary application materials, send them to: Adult & Transfer Center, Sullivan Center for Student Services, Loyola University Chicago, 1032 W. Sheridan Road, Room 150, Chicago, IL 60660.

What scholarships are available?

Loyola offers transfer merit scholarships based upon college gpa at the time of admission. We also offer a Phi Theta Kappa scholarship for members transferring from community colleges. We encourage you explore outside scholarships. A good place to begin your search is at LUC.edu/scholarships. Can I get my transcripts evaluated?

We will complete an official transfer credit evaluation after you are offered admission to Loyola. Prior to admission, check out our MyList interactive online transfer credit tool to see how your credits may transfer. Visit LUC.edu/mylist.

Can I defer my admission?

We do not offer deferred admission. Please contact your transfer admission counselor to find out about entering at a later term.

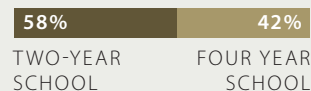

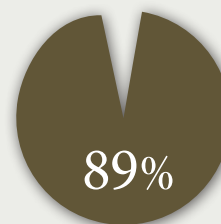

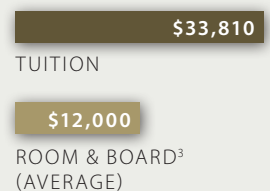


FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE¹
