Biographical Sketch

Henry Cohen was born in Brooklyn, NY, in 1933. He received his BA from Columbia University in 1955 and his Ph.D. from Cornell University in 1965. Before joining Loyola as an assistant professor of History in 1969, Cohen taught at The Ohio State University from 1962 to 1964 and at California State College at Long Beach from 1964 to 1969. He was the founder and editor of “criminal Justice History” and author of “Business and Politics in America from the Age of Jackson to the Civil War” and “Brutal Justice”.

Scope and Content

The Henry Cohen, Ph.D., papers comprise .74 linear foot spanning the years 1825 to 1987 (bulk 1967-1987) and include syllabi, exams, reading packets, newspaper clippings, articles, book excerpts, and correspondence. Of special note are the photocopies of letters written by Chicago lawyer, and first dean of Loyola’s School of Law, William Dillon. The originals of these letters are at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland.
