### Biographical Sketch

Martin Heidegger was a renowned 20<sup>th</sup> century philosopher and founder of phenomenological ontology. He was born on September 26, 1889, in Messkirch in southwest Germany, and died on May 26, 1976. He is buried in the churchyard at Messkirch.

Heidegger's interest in philosophy began during his high school studies in Freiburg. Upon entering Freiburg University he began studying Theology, but eventually changed to the study of philosophy, mathematics, and natural sciences. One of his main influences during this time was Edmund Husserl.

Upon completion of his dissertation, Heidegger taught at Freiburg University before moving to Marburg University in 1923. In the 1930s he returned to Freiburg University, where he was elected rector. From the 1940s until the end of his life, Heidegger spent his time writing, publishing, and lecturing.

## **Scope and Content**

The Martin Heidegger collection consists of 1.75 linear feet spanning the years from approximately 1918 to 1976. The collection includes typescripts and photocopies of notes and manuscripts, and one recording (record album) of a Martin Heidegger speech.

This collection was formerly known as the Heidegger-Fiand collection and was originally in 7 half-size boxes. It has been incorporated into 5 boxes and re-folded.

### **Series 1: Martin Heidegger Manuscripts, ca. 1918-1976, Boxes 1 -4**

This series contains typescripts and photocopies of notes and manuscripts by Martin Heidegger, renowned 20<sup>th</sup> century philosopher, typed by his brother Fritz Heidegger.

### **Series 2: Martin Heidegger Recordings, 1960, Box 5**

This series contains one double record album (lp) recording of a Martin Heidegger speech “Holderlins Erde Und Himmel”.
