FIRST- AND SECOND-YEAR ADVISING

COURSES FOR YOUR DEVELOPMENT

As you navigate your Loyola Experience, we offer a range of courses designed to support your development and success. Here are a few highlights.

UNIV 101: FIRST-YEAR SEMINAR

Meet first-year students and gain an understanding of the University, city of Chicago, resources, academics, and more in this extended orientation that focuses on academic success and the transition to college.

UNIV 102: LOYOLA SEMINAR

First- and second-year students explore an academic area or topic of interest by a faculty member without the need for prior knowledge or coursework on the subject.

UNIV 112: STRATEGIES IN LEARNING

First- and second-year students can empower themselves by strengthening academic skills for success in and out of the classroom.

UNIV 201: TRANSFER SEMINAR

Transfer students explore what it means to be a successful Loyola student and make connections with classmates while learning about services and keeping you on schedule for graduation.

UNIV 224: CAREER AND LIFE PLANNING
